PLEASE READ THESE REGISTRATION AND CANCELLATION POLICIES CAREFULLY.

Registrations are made in the order they are received and must be accompanied by payment to be valid.

If a class must be cancelled because of insufficient enrollment, the office will phone or email families prior to the first day of class and a full refund will be given. If a student cancels a class prior to five working days before the first class meeting, tuition will be refunded at 100 percent less a \$5 administrative fee.

No refunds will be issued within 5 working days prior to the first class meeting. However, transfers to other classes will be honored at 100 percent credit if class minimums and maximums are not affected. Tuition is not prorated for missed classes.

SCHOLARSHIPS

A limited number of scholarships are available for students who would not otherwise be able to attend classes because of a lack of funds. Please inquire with Phipps staff if you are in need of assistance.

WHAT TO WEAR AND BRING TO CAMP

Wear comfortable attire to be able to move, play and get messy, some art materials may stain. Please note specific attire requirements in the class descriptions. The Phipps is not responsible for clothing that is damaged in classes.

Bring a nut-free snack and a labeled water bottle to all classes that run two hours or longer.

Students must not be left unattended while at the Phipps. Students enrolled in both a morning and afternoon class receive free supervision between classes. Pre-registration is required on the first day of class. Students must be checked in and out by an adult each day.

ADAPTIVE DANCE

Adaptive Dance is designed for teens and young adults with special needs. The class will provide students with the opportunity to express and learn in a creative, nurturing, and friendly environment. The goal of this class is to introduce students to the creative and expressive elements of dance while allowing self-expression and inspire learning. The class will be interactive and involve fun activities such as circle time, stretching, sing-alongs, and creative movement. Students will develop independence, balance, self-confidence, and a love for music and movement. Parents and caregivers are welcome to take part in the class.

BALLET

Ballet technique is foundational training for many forms of dance. Ballet classes at the Phipps focus on developing a dancer's understanding of correct alignment, proper use of turn out, coordination of the upper body, musicality, and strength. Classes are structured around classical training, emphasizing work at the barre and culminating with combinations and variations in center. Ballet vocabulary is built throughout each level and increases in difficulty.

BALLET POINTE

Ballet levels 3, 4 and 5 have the option of taking an additional class for pointe work. Pointe technique builds on regular ballet technique and requires more advanced strength and technique to execute. Ballet technique class is required before pointe work to ensure dancers muscles are warm and trained to perform en pointe.

CONTEMPORARY

Contemporary dance is a modern art form that infuses methods of ballet, jazz, and modern, creating a fluid style of movement that encourages self-expression. It explores dynamic movements and music that can be unconventional, abstract, and deeply artistic. Students will participate in a warmup, series of across-the-floor combinations, and a culmination of choreography.

THOMASINA TOPBEAR is a self-taught Santee Dakota and Oglala Lakota muralist. She has been a member of the international all female street art crew Few and Far Women since 2015. She helped found City Mischief Murals, an all BIPOC mural collective that actively paints large scale community-based murals in the Twin Cities. She has organized local and national community-based murals focusing on youth, women, activism and BIPOC artists. Thomasina's inspirations come from her indigenous culture and graffiti style type lettering. She uses these influences to express her feelings on community, social justice, culture, feminism, and togetherness.

JODI YOUNGMAN has been an elementary art teacher for twenty years, the last fifteen here in Hudson. She earned her PK-12 Art Education Bachelor's degree and Master of Education degree from UW-River Falls. Jodi's personal art explores texture and reusing materials in a new and inventive way.
