### Drips and Drops (online class) Ages 10+ Instructor: Deanna Grigus

Have FUN and create one-of-a-kind projects in this online class. You will learn how to use vibrant alcohol inks on a variety of surfaces. A kit will be mailed to you with enough supplies for this class, as well as a few extra projects to do on your own.

### St. Croix RiverFest: Whirligigs and Outdoor Wind Sculptures Ages 7 – 9 and 9 – 12 Instructor: Joseph Haid

Working with simple materials like wire, paper, fabric, and paint, students will create sculptures that use air currents to move, spin, or whirl! Each sculpture will be a personal expression to celebrate the arts and nature. To better understand the beauty of motion and inspire the students, the instructor will show examples of kinetic art. Students will make up to two sculptures – one to bring home & one to display in front of The Phipps throughout St. Croix RiverFest.

We will explore the islands and inlets of this quiet, sparkling area just off Lakefront Park in Hudson, stopping at "Mussel Island" to wade in the water and learn about one of our most mysterious and precious water heroes.

Explore the shoreline of the St. Croix River, learn about some of the creatures that make the river their home, and create a sculpture that shows a unique perspective. Students will create their own individual 3D plywood sculptures and work together on one temporary collaborative installation.

**Drawing the World Around Us**  
**Ages 9 – 13**

This class will guide students through a series of fun but challenging observational drawing activities, inspired by Hudson's historic downtown and beautiful riverfront. Each day will include both guided practice exercises and opportunities to apply those skills expressively. Materials include pencil, ink pen, and watercolor pencils.

**Outdoor Art Camp**

Each print is unique and mono-printing allows for a certain amount of freedom and expression. Students will incorporate elements of nature using this printmaking process.

The Phipps has created four Ceramic Project Kits, two for beginner/intermediate students and two for intermediate/advanced students, which will be available for you to pick up and work with clay in the comfort of your home and on your own time!

Each kit contains all of the materials necessary, including clay and colorful underglazes, as well as handouts with step-by-step instructions, to make two projects. Everyone who signs up for a kit also will be given access to a short instructional video on specific techniques.

Reptiles, amphibians, and birds, oh my! In this video offering, meet several live animals from the St. Croix River Valley and use them as inspiration for your art. There are six videos total: three focus on the animals and three with animal craft projects using paint, beads, paper, string, stones, recycled materials, and more!

### Summer Art Camp Instructors

**Abrakadoodle** is a leader in art programming for elementary-age children, featuring fresh, exciting visual arts projects that inspire a child's imagination. Lessons, taught by professional and caring art teachers, are colorful, engaging, and fun.

**Jessie Eckroad** is the outreach program coordinator and animal care coordinator at Carpenter St. Croix Valley Nature Center (CNC). She specializes in bringing educational and entertaining environmental programming to the southeast metro and surrounding areas. In addition to her work at CNC, Jessie is a painter, photographer, and all-around crafter. Whenever possible, she works to teach and learn about the environment through art and loves to share her passion with others.

**Deanna Grigus** has a B.F.A. degree in Art with an emphasis in photography. She creates her photography and mixed media art from her home studio and exhibits, sells, and has photography in permanent collections throughout the region. Deanna has taught classes at The Phipps for sixteen years.

**Joseph Haid** received his MFA from the School of the Art Institute of Chicago in 1992 and his BFA and art teaching certification in 1980. For more than 30 years, he taught at many K-12 public and private schools and at various universities. He retired in 2014 from the University of Wisconsin – Stout where he was the Program Director in Art Education from 2000-2014.

**Liz Malanaphy** has taught *Just Add Water* art and nature classes at The Phipps for ten years. The *Just Add Water* experience is hands-on fun for young artists and scientists who want to learn more about the world around them. Liz is a mother of five who has worked with hundreds of students through the Hudson Destination Imagination program and various other community projects.

**Amy Noonan** is a high energy, enthusiastic instructor whose passion for learning and exploration are contagious. Amy strives to create an environment that is engaging, fun, and highly productive. She holds a Bachelor of Science degree in Art Education from the University of Wisconsin, Madison and a Master of Science in Education-Fine Arts from the University of Wisconsin, River Falls. Amy has been attending workshops, making art, and teaching for more than 30 years. Her wide range of experiences, extensive training as a teacher, and unique style creates a rich learning environment for students of all ages and experience levels.

**Hillary Price** earned her MFA with a focus in painting and installation at the University of Minnesota. She is a maker of objects and images that question reality through the use of non-traditional materials and interactive technology. With experience working in galleries and classrooms ranging from elementary to college, Hillary leverages her unique art world perspective to inspire her students to share their voices in the classroom and beyond.

**Thomasina Topbear** is a self-taught Santee Dakota & Oglala Lakota muralist. She has been a member of the international all-female street art crew Few & Far Women since 2015. Thomasina helped found City Mischief Murals, an all BIPOC mural collective that actively paints large-scale, community-based murals in the Twin Cities. She has organized a number of local and national community-based murals focusing on youth, women, activism, and BIPOC artists. Thomasina's inspirations come from her Indigenous culture and graffiti-style type lettering. She uses these influences to express her feelings on community, social justice, culture, feminism, and togetherness.

**Michael Weatherly** is a contemporary printmaker living in Elbow Lake, Minnesota. He received his BA from the University of Minnesota Morris in Art History with a minor in Studio Art and an emphasis in printmaking. During college, Michael discovered mono-printing and currently incorporates this printmaking technique with manipulated digital images in his art. Michael has been the recipient of several artist grants including the McKnight Foundation Artist Grant, Minnesota Arts and Cultural Heritage Grants, and Individual Artist Grants from the Lake Regions Arts Council.

## SUMMER ART CAMP 2021 REGISTRATION

### **PLEASE READ THESE REGISTRATION AND CANCELLATION POLICIES CAREFULLY.**

Registrations are made in the order they are received online only and must be accompanied by payment to be valid. As part of the online registration process, you will be asked to read and review an electronic Covid Waiver. An email confirmation will be sent upon registration. If a class must be cancelled because of insufficient enrollment, the office will email students prior to the first day of class and a full refund will be given. If a student cancels a class prior to five working days before the first class meeting, tuition will be refunded less a \$5 administrative fee. No refunds will be issued within 5 working days prior to the first class meeting. However, transfers to other classes will be honored at full credit if class minimums and maximums are not affected. Tuition is not prorated for missed classes.

**Scholarships** - A limited number of partial scholarships are available for students who would not otherwise be able to attend classes because of financial needs. Please inquire at [info@thephipps.org](mailto:info@thephipps.org) if you are in need of this assistance.

**What to Wear and Bring to Camp** - Dress to get messy, some art materials may stain. The Phipps is not responsible for clothing that is damaged in art classes.

- Prepare to be outside and to walk.
- Dress appropriately, wear a hat, comfortable shoes, and wear and bring sun protection.
- Bring a nut-free snack to all classes that run two hours or longer.
- Bring a filled water bottle as water fountains are not available.
- Class will be held primarily outdoors and in Lakefront Park. If it rains class will be held under tents or moved inside.

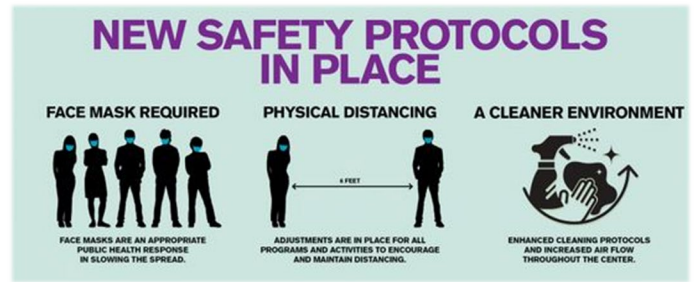
**Class Sizes** - All classes will be limited to 8 students and held primarily outdoors, unless noted.

**Please Note** - Students must not be left unattended while at The Phipps. Students must be checked in and out by an adult each day.

Supervised lunch hour is available and free to students enrolled in both morning and afternoon classes for that day. Cost is \$10 per day for any student enrolled in either a morning or afternoon class that day. Pre-registration is required.
